◆There are 102 PA programs that require a Bachelor's degree in the United States (AAPA)

- ADVANTAGES of not having a Bachelor's degree
  - Increases the number of applicants
     Shortens route to being a licensed medical practitioner.
     Less educational requirements
- DISADVANTAGES of not having a Bachelor's degree
  - Not having a Liberal
  - part of college abroad
- Less exposure to cultural diversities and life experiences.

- ◆ Recent Trends
  - More applicants have Bachelor's degrees.
  - There is an increase in the number Master's programs in the United States

Should PA programs become Master's programs? How many programs are now granting Master degrees in the U.S.?

- In the U.S., there are 102 PA programs that grant a Master's degree.
